NUTRITION

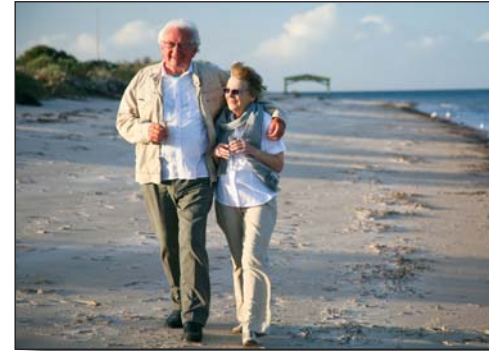
